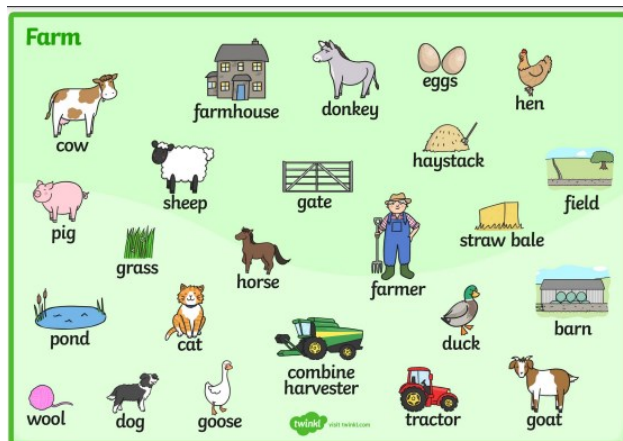

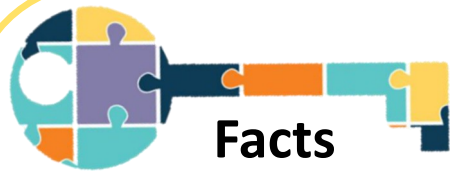

Facts

A farm is a piece of land used to grow crops and/or raise animals for produce. People who grow this produce are called “farmers”, and their work is called “farming”.

Arable farms are those which produce crops (e.g. wheat or vegetables), while pastoral farms are those where animals are raised for meat, wool or dairy products. Mixed farming is, as the name suggests, a combination farm that grows crops as well as keeps animals.

Lots of animals and their babies live on the farmyard including, goats & kids, pigs & piglets, cows & calves, horses & foals, hens & chicks, ducks & ducklings, geese & goslings. They have homes in barns, pens and fields.

Farmers use machines to help them harvest the fields and produce the foods that are then sold in shops & markets.
